Welcome to the Purdue Global Academic Support Center, a study studio and learning center for writing, math, science, technology, business, and academic success.

The Center invites all graduate and undergraduate students to explore and use the Center's dynamic learning resources and personalized online services including Live Tutoring, Paper and Project Review, Q&A, and Live and Recorded Webinars.

In the ASC, you'll find web tutorials and printable downloads, videos with closed captioning and the podcasts with transcripts. The ASC archives its live webinars later viewing and offers study skills tutorials and tools and citation guides for academic writing and research.

The ASC landing page makes it easy to find what you are looking for.

The Resources menu opens APA Style Central as well as the ASC's own videos and citation guides made especially for Purdue Global students.

The Study Skills link opens not only a page of tutorials to help you get started with all your studies, but also our public-facing portal inside the Purdue Global Library. Click around the tabs to explore Plagiarism Information, a student introduction to TurnItIn, and examples of how to use and cite research in your writing. Check out our every growing FAQ too!

Have questions? Connect with a tutor! Select which type of expert you want to talk to.

The ASC uses a platform called Cranium Café for Live Tutoring. Tutors in all Centers have Cranium Café Cards, and when online, there is a Knock on Door button, and it's as simple as that!

You'll be invited into the tutor's Cranium Café tutoring room where you can work together using audio, video, and tools for sharing your screen, your paper or project, or for working out problems.

Tutors will also give you expert advice and feedback on your papers and projects.

From the ASC homepage, go to Submit a Paper or Question, and choose from the Centers.

Tutors will annotate your paper with comments and screencast your paper in order to talk through ideas and areas to address as you revise and edit or work on the next steps.

To submit a paper, project, or a question, click the calendar icon on the tutor's Café Card. This is not a live meeting. You can then expect your review or feedback by email within two hours of the time you select.

Webinars are another way receive live support from an expert tutor or faculty member. Open the Webinar Calendar and archives right from the ASC page.

Connect with other students and learn about important topics related to your studies.

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On the calendar, scroll down to see upcoming live webinars and scroll up to see recorded webinars. Click the title to open the details. Or refer to the Recent Recordings tabs.

The Academic Support Center serves all Purdue Global students with diverse resources, tutoring services, interactive webinars, and useful tools for all learning styles and needs. In the Writing Center, support is also available for English Language Learners and students learning writing fundamentals.

Use the ELL page to initiate support and outreach, ask a question, or to access the ELL Resource Library.

The Writing Fundamentals page has similar forms for requesting support or asking a question, and for accessing the Fundamentals Resource Library as well as the First-Term Student Resources.

Download first-term resources and save them to your computer for quick access to helpful tips and links to more support and examples.
