Enclosed are reference tools for Refrigerator Water Filters. These reference tools will help you to easily identify the part number of many of the most common filters. Refrigerator water filters are frequently purchased items that manufacturers recommend replacing every 6 months.

Whirlpool Water Filter Reference Guide

This guide is applicable for Whirlpool, KitchenAid, Maytag, Amana and Jenn-Air refrigerators.

To use it, follow the three steps on the front of the guide. These three simple steps will help you identify the part number of the water filter for your customer. You can then enter the number in the PartScription search bar to locate and purchase the item.

Kenmore Water Filter Conversion Guide



The enclosed Kenmore Water Filter Conversion Guide will allow you to convert a part number from a Kenmore filter to one of the major manufacturer part numbers that are contained within PartScription.

The customer can obtain the original Kenmore water filter number from the filter itself or the Use and Care Guide of the refrigerator.

- ❖ The impurities of tap water can affect your family's health. Impurities can also adversely affect the components of your refrigerator.
- ❖ Most manufacturers recommend replacing refrigerator water filters every 6 months. This typically represents 750 gallons of water consumption for a family of 4. However, the size of your family, the gallons of water consumed and the amount of contaminants in your water can increase or decrease the need to change your filter. For best results, consider replacing your filter every 6 months.
- ❖ \$\$ ECONOMY PACKS. Purchasing multi-packs can save time and money. Water filter part numbers that end in "P", "T" or "BULK" are multi-packs. "P" = 2 pack; "T" = 3 pack; "BULK" = 12 pack.
- ❖ There are vast differences in the impurities of tap water by geographical region. You can obtain a water report from most municipalities so you can purchase the filter that is right for you. Many filters have a Standard version and an Advanced version. Both filter out sediment, rust, lead, mercury and reduce chlorine. The Advanced versions filter out Cysts (common water-borne microbiological parasites) and additional contaminants. NOT all municipalities have cysts in their water, so the Standard version could be suitable for use, is a wise choice and more economical for many households.
- ❖ It is more economical to drink filtered water rather than to buy bottled water, AND filtered water leaves beneficial fluoride in the water.
- ❖ BE GREEN. Filtering your water rather than buying bottled water keeps plastic out of our landfills!
- ❖ CLEANER, HEALTHIER, GREAT TASTING WATER & ICE!

ALWAYS follow the instructions provided with your refrigerator and water filter to properly select a filter and maintain the water filtration system.
