We Remain Faithful In Sincere And Pure Devotion
2 Corinthians 11:1-33

1. What is “divine jealousy” (11:1-2)?
2. Paul writes that he had “betrothed” these Christians “to one husband” (11:2). What does this mean? Does this betrothal still apply to modern followers of Christ?
3. Paul also reveals the end goal of the betrothal in 11:2—“to present you as a pure virgin to Christ.” What does this mean? Has this presentation already occurred or is it yet future?
4. In your own words, what is “a sincere and pure devotion to Christ” (11:3)?
5. How do the “thoughts” of men and women continue to deceptively be “led astray” from the Spirit’s goal of “sincere and pure devotion” (11:3)?
6. Paul warns against “another Jesus,” “a different spirit,” and “a different gospel” in 11:4. What are these and why would they be so devastating to “sincere and pure devotion”?
7. In your own words, summarize the alarming warning of 11:12-15.
8. What is Paul doing in 11:16-29?
9. What do you think Paul means by “the daily pressure on me of my anxiety for all the churches” (11:28)? Why would he include this pressure in the list he began in 11:23?
10. Practically speaking, how can one “boast of the things that show [his] weakness” (11:30)? Realistically, why would a disciple of Christ even do such a thing?
