2 Corinthians 13:1-14

1. As Paul begins to conclude this powerful letter, how would you summarize what is on his mind in 13:1-4?
2. Practically speaking, how could Paul assert that Christ “is not weak in dealing with you, but is powerful among you” (13:3)?
3. We get the feeling that a profound parallel is being drawn in 13:4. What is that parallel?
4. In real-life, everyday terms, how do disciples of Christ meet the divine expectation to “examine [our]selves” (13:5)?
5. Why would Paul instruct these Christians “to see whether [they] are in the faith” (13:5)?
6. “Test yourselves” (13:5). What does this mean and how is it done?
7. What practical difference does the realization “that Christ Jesus is in you” make (13:5)?
8. In your own words, what is Paul saying in 13:8?
9. Why does Paul “finally” encourage his brethren in Corinth to “rejoice” (13:11)?
10. What should we make of the final rapid-fire admonitions in 13:11-13?
