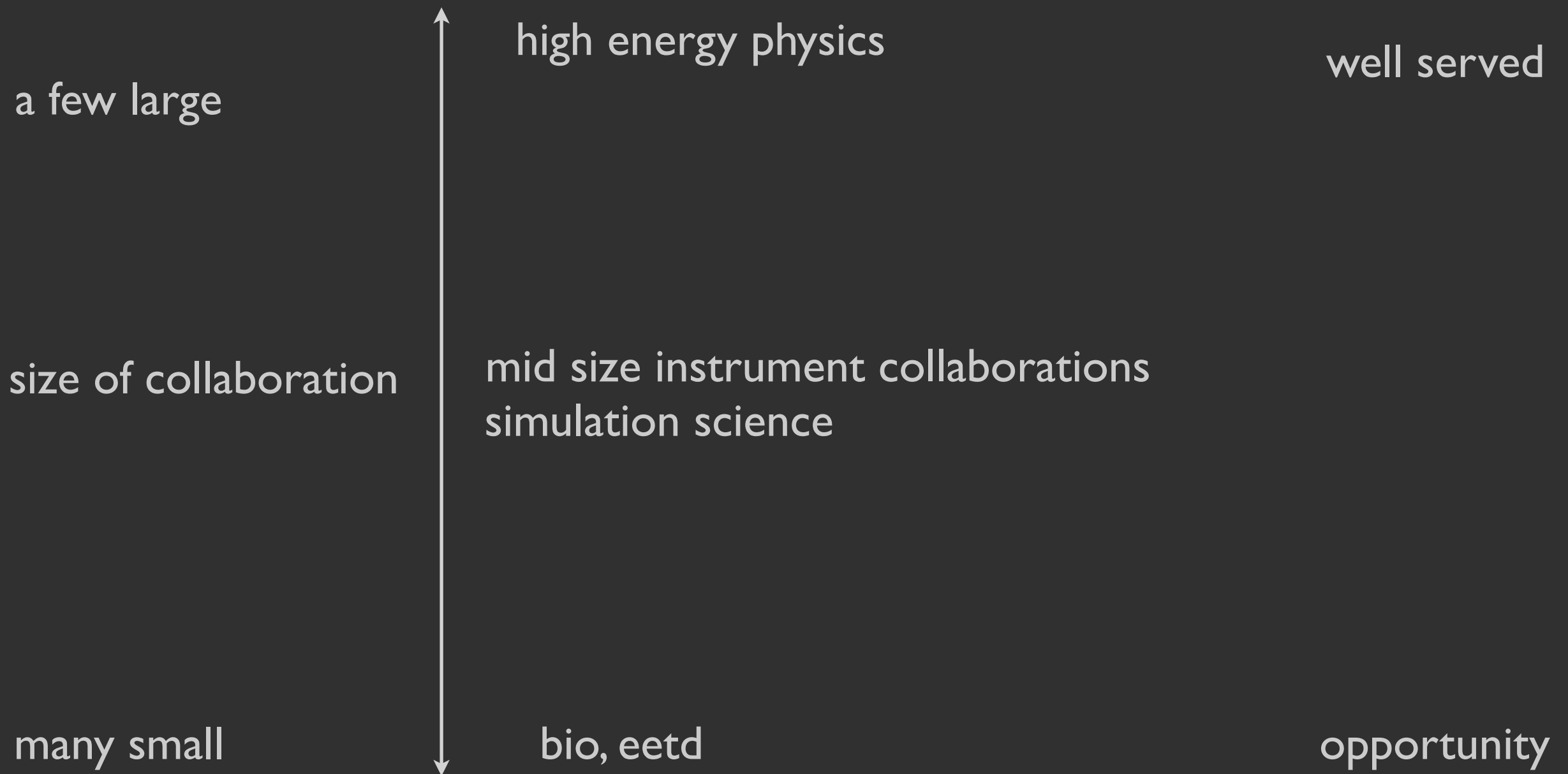

# gdocs.lbl.gov

documents, spreadsheets, and presentations

all lbl people have accounts

share and collaborate with anyone with a google account.

publish openly, or restrict to individuals.

work together in realtime

# gsites.lbl.gov

small collaborative websites: reviews, small projects

restrict editing and viewing, or publish openly

integrate content, share files, wiki-like functionality

fast simple sharing

# commons.lbl.gov

powerful collab tool based on wiki-thinking.

will be “federated” early FY10

has replaced existing wiki, should replace eRoom for many at LBL.

this tool gets better the more you use it. many “hidden” features.

eroom

it's (past) time

12-18 month transition period

play with the other tools and figure out what works for you.

highly document-centric collaborations are the most challenging.

webspace

great for large scale file storage and external collaboration  
a specialized tool

some features now supported in gdocs

ecm

who at berkeley lab needs a “real” enterprise  
content management system  
*workflow, archiving, true document management,  
hooks, scans, etc..*
