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# Interprofessional Education (IPE)

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- The learning that “occurs when students from two or more professions learn about, from and with each other to enable effective collaboration and improve health outcomes” (World Health Organization, 2010, p. 7)

# Interprofessional Education (IPE)

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- The process by which practitioners (including students) are trained or educated to work collaboratively (Canadian Interprofessional Health Collaborative [CIHC], 2010).

# Interprofessional Collaboration (IPC)

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- Learners / practitioners, patients / clients / families, and communities develop and maintain interprofessional working relationships that enable optimal health outcomes (CIHC, 2010, p. 6)

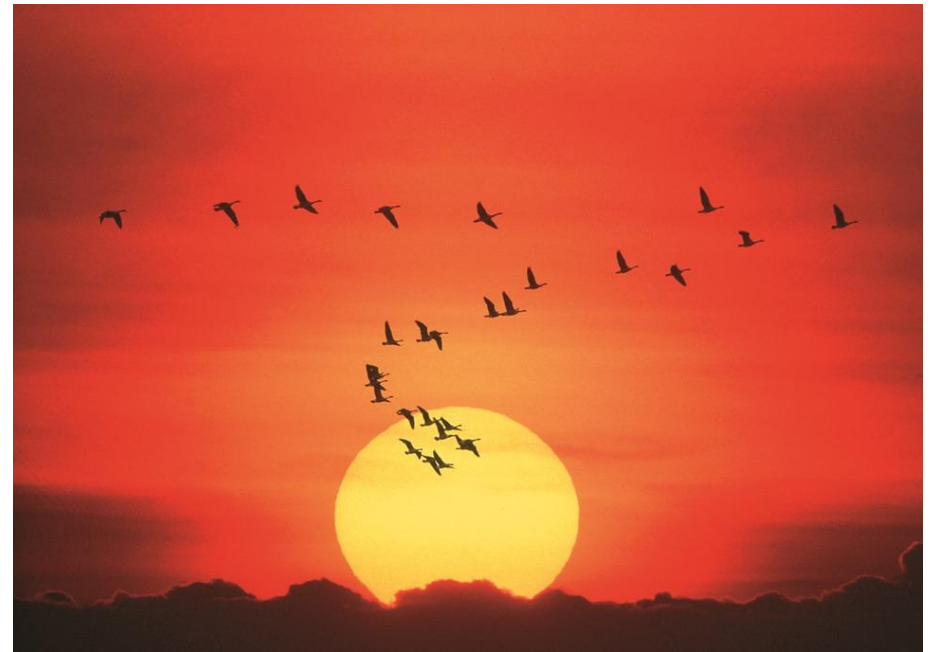
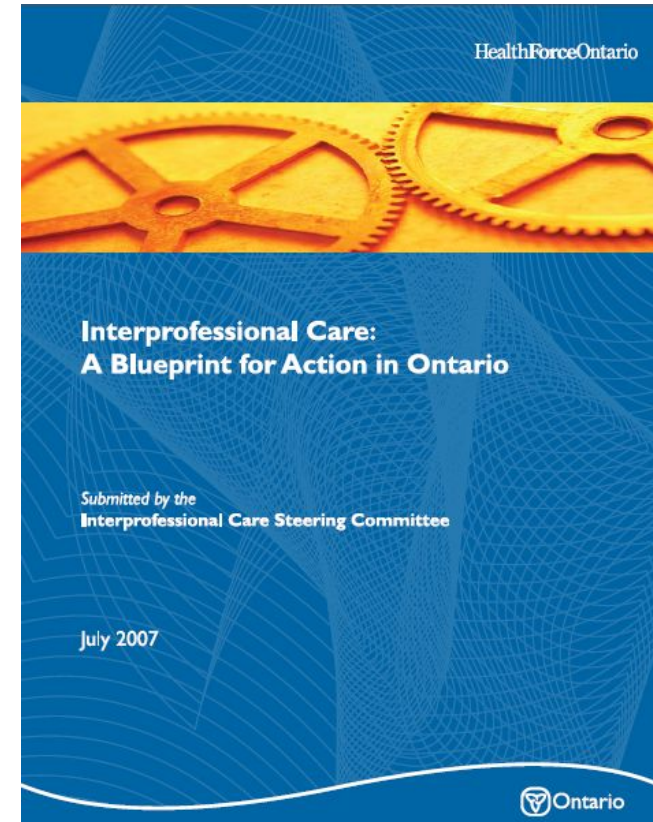


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# Interprofessional Care

- The provision of comprehensive health services to patients by multiple health caregivers who work collaboratively to deliver quality care within and across settings (Healthforce Ontario, 2007)

# Collaborative Practice

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- When healthcare providers work with people from within their own profession, with people outside of their profession and with patients/clients and their families (CIHC, 2010)



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# Multidisciplinary

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- An approach where team members work independently and interact formally.
- Each member does “his or her own thing” with little or no awareness of other disciplines’ work.

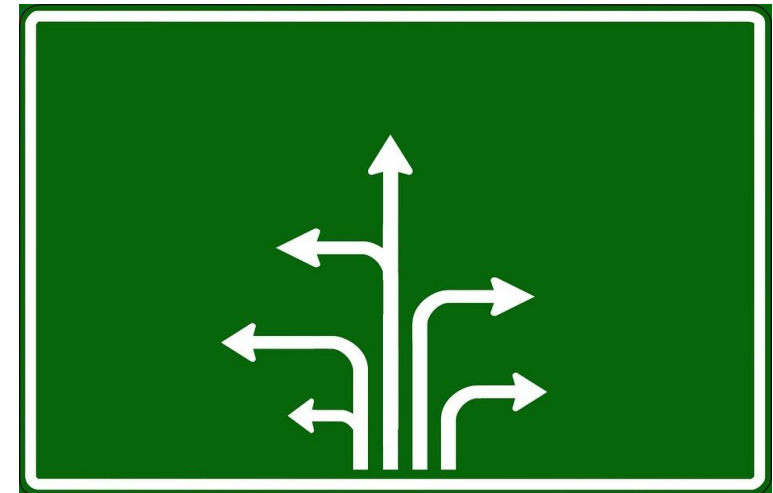
