Revelation 10-11: The Time for Wrath and Reward

1. By its use of “Then,” Revelation 10:1 assumes we remember the context of what is happening in this revelation. Take a moment to remind yourself: what is going on?
2. Why do you think at this point in the revelation a voice from heaven would tell John, “Seal up what the seven thunders have said, and do not write it down” (10:1-4)?
3. In your own words, what has been revealed to John in Revelation 10:5-7?
4. John is not the first person in the Bible told to eat a scroll. Ezekiel was told to do the same (Ezek 3:1-11). Having taken the time to read both accounts, what is this “eating” all about?
5. John was forewarned, “Take and eat it; it will make your stomach bitter, but in your mouth it will be sweet as honey” (10:9). What was God really telling John ahead of time about the contents of this scroll?
6. Once again, readers of Revelation 11:1-3 may remember that Ezekiel was shown something similar (Ezek 40:1-4). What is the significance in Revelation 11 of the temple of God, the altar, and those who worship there being measured?
