

The Roles & Responsibilities of a Cell Leader

1. Personal Commitment

- To read the Bible consistently and meditate on it daily.
- To pray daily for the Pastors, the church, the cell members, your family and yourself.
- To actively attend at least one prayer meeting either on a Saturday morning or before church services with Pastor Harold.
- To regularly attend the weekly Sunday Celebration services and be an active financial partner in this ministry (eg. tithing).
- To accept the discipline of this church and those in authority over you, working as a team of God's servants for the sake of Christ and His Church.

2. Shepherding

- To provide pastoral care to the cell members under your charge.
- To be faithful and diligent in serving your people by keeping guard over yourself and all the cell members over which the Holy Spirit has made you an overseer, encouraging them by sound doctrine and refuting those who oppose it.
- To promote unity, peace and love among all Christians, especially among those whom you serve.
- To visit the homes of believers and unbelievers with your cell members.
- To visit sick and troubled members in hospital and at home.
- To encourage every cell member to be baptized and to be a member of LFCC within 6 months of cell attendance.
- To prepare for and facilitate the weekly cell meetings according to the prescribed format.
- To appoint and mentor the BCC leaders.
- To create a warm and comfortable atmosphere for the homecell.

3. Discipling / Training

- To ensure that each cell member is born again, baptized in water, baptized with the Holy Spirit and has done the E-Course.

- To ensure that cell members regularly attend the weekly Sunday Celebration services and prayer meetings.
- To prayerfully select at least three cell member and to groom him / her as the BCC leader and possible new Cell Leader.

4. Friendship / Cell Evangelism

- To win others to Christ enthusiastically.
- To keep track of cell members' evangelism and visitation program. This means that as individuals and as a cell the oikos connections of all cell members must be penetrated.
- To initiate cell outreaches through the BCCs to hospitals, institutions, street evangelism and prayer walks in the local area.
- To encourage members to start Interest groups, homogeneous cells and bring outsiders to the various Christian clubs.
- To ensure the attendance and participation of cell members at church-wide launches and outreaches.

5. Managment / Administration

- To be a link between LFCC, the BCC leaders and cell members. This implies prompt communication both up and down the organizational lines.
- To submit the weekly cell report promptly by Sunday night. These reports must be completed as thoroughly as possible.
- To attend regular meetings with the respective Cluster Leader / District Pastor which is usually once a month.
- To attend the quarterly leadership training seminars at LFCC.
- To attend the quarterly Cluster celebration / party as organized by the Cluster Leader.
